* Eligible nominees for the 2019-2020 school year are noted on the nomination form. Nominees must have completed 3 full years at SHS. In addition, teachers and staff are only eligible to be nominated if they have not received the award within the past 3 years.

MAP Assessments – Math and Language Grades 4-8 (Grade 3 Optional)

Given the unique situation we find ourselves in with remote learning, we believe gathering some of the spring data from MAP assessment will be particularly beneficial as we plan not only the rest of this school year but how we approach next year.

For this reason, we will conduct **remote MAP assessments in Math and Language**. Both tests will be conducted on the same day and students who test will not have any additional classes that day.

- **Tuesday, May 19**: Middle School Math and Language No other classes that day
- Thursday, May 21: Grades 4-5 Math and Language No other classes that day

• **Thursday, May 21**: Grade 3 Testing by teacher request or optional Math and Language (more information to follow)




Facebook Student Spotlights

You will receive confirmation of enrollment (or notice of waitlist placement if necessary) **no later than the end of June**. I anticipate being able to approve all applications that are submitted prior to summer break. Next school year we will be introducing an afterschool ESS option for our Pre-K program.
