

Planning Ahead

Superintendent Reykdal announced yesterday that the goal is for schools to open in person this fall under the guidelines of the local health department. We are still waiting to receive those guidelines from the King County Health Department as well as written guidelines from the state superintendent's office. As soon as we have those we can begin to finalize our plans for returning to school with the necessary health and safety precautions in place. As a part of that planning process, we would greatly appreciate it if you would take a few minutes to complete a short survey about our current remote instruction, summer plans, and your thoughts about the return to school. One thing that sounds likely is a requirement for teachers to wear masks and at least a strong recommendation for and students to do so as well. We understand that this may be more challenging for some than others. In order to make this as easy as possible on everyone, we will allow students to wear any "school appropriate" cloth mask. We ask that every student have two masks at school each day in case one becomes wet or dirty and that masks are washed each day. We are also making plans to provide remote instruction for those students who are unable to return to in-person instruction immediately in the fall. David Burroughs

Tuition Payments for 2020-2021 School Year

Two options to manage your tuition payments:

Monthly Tuition Payments:

Families who signed up for monthly tuition payments via FACTS for this upcoming school year will be receiving an email notification this week to set up their FACTS payment plans. FACTS payment plans must be set up by the finalization deadline, June 25th. Tuition payments for the 2020-2021 school year begin in July and will run for 12 months through June 2021. Please refer to the <u>FACTS</u> <u>Tuition Flyer</u> for additional details.

One Time Payment in Full:

Families who signed up to pay their 2020-2021 tuition in full by check will be receiving a tuition invoice via email before July 1st. Payment is due by August 31st.

ESS Registration for 2020-2021

ESS applications for next school year are now available online. Please fill out the editable PDF, found at the bottom of that page, and email it to Amy Davis rather than submitting a hard copy. You will receive confirmation of enrollment (or notice of waitlist placement if necessary) no later than the end of June. I anticipate being able to approve all applications that are submitted prior to summer break. Next school year we will be introducing an afterschool ESS option for our Pre-K program. If the combination of ESS fees and tuition creates an unmanageable financial burden for your family, please contact David Burroughs to discuss tuition assistance. If the program does not fill to capacity, we will be able to offer a soccer season plan for those who only need ESS through the end of October. If this is possible, it will be communicated in August. I speak for the entire ESS team when I say we cannot wait to resume ESS and care for your kiddos in September!
