### ESS Registration for 2020-2021

ESS applications for next school year are now available <a href="online">online</a>. Please fill out the editable PDF, found at the bottom of that page, and email it to <a href="Amy Davis">Amy Davis</a> rather than submitting a hard copy. You will receive confirmation of enrollment (or notice of waitlist placement if necessary) no later than the end of June. I anticipate being able to approve all applications that are submitted prior to summer break. Next school year we will be introducing an afterschool ESS option for our Pre-K program. If the combination of ESS fees and tuition creates an unmanageable financial burden for your family, please contact <a href="David Burroughs">David Burroughs</a> to discuss tuition assistance. If the program does not fill to capacity, we will be able to offer a soccer season plan for those who only need ESS through the end of October. If this is possible, it will be communicated in August. I speak for the entire ESS team when I say we cannot wait to resume ESS and care for your kiddos in September!

Microsoft Steam is an Office365 application that you may have never heard of before we went remote! Now, it is one of our most used apps, since it stores all of our recorded live lessons and other videos that both teachers and students have created.

What makes Stream so special? It is just like YouTube, but it is secure for Sacred Heart. Only users with an @sacredheart.org email address can access the content. Yes, this can be inconvenient for parents who can't log in with their own email address, but it keeps all of the videos safe for our students. Simply log in with your child's email address to see the videos!
