

Jubilee Reach

Thanks to the generosity of our school families as well as some friends of our school families and Sacred Heart parishioners, we are now helping to feed over 1200 families in need by donating more than 100 bags of groceries each week to Jubilee Reach.



With the many changes in our daily lives right now, it is important to form healthy routines and habits, just as our teachers do at the start of each new school year. One important area in which to support our children is helping them to stay focused and on task.

Technology can bring with it many distractions, especially as we increase the frequency of use. Our students have been around technology their entire lives, and don't always realize how distracting it can be. "Multitasking" checking emails, playing games, responding to messages, joining meetings, online shopping, checking texts, changing music, etc. can truly slow down work and cause stress and anxiety without us realizing it! Goal: Write the sentence and string of numbers below as fast as you can, as you see them.

Frog and Toad (3rd and 4th graders)
