

ARE YOU PRACTICING YOUR POPCORN WORDS EACH NIGHT? Next week is our last new set of popcorn words. After your child masters these new six words for next week, he/she will know how to read 88 frequently used words! Can you believe it? We will be testing the children in a few weeks on all 88 words. Remember, for a word to be considered mastered, your child must read the word accurately, without guessing or hesitation, on the first try. Please continue to work on these words with your child every day

Math

Next week in math, we compare capacities using different containers. We will take our chapter 19 assessment and then begin our new unit on money.

Sight Words

Sight words last week were: look, very, their, saw, put, out.

Next week: off, our, day, take, too, show. Add these words to your flashcards and practice daily

Religion

Next week in Religion, we will discuss virtues and Peacemakers. We will define each Peacemaker Virtue and give examples of how one can live that virtue. We will complete chapter 20 in our Call to Faith Books, "Be Like God."

Reading and Writing

Next week in Reading and Literacy, we will introduce our six new popcorn words and our two new letters of the week, "Yy" and "Qq." We will continue with word building activities and discuss the main idea of a story and story details.

In Writing, we will introduce prepositions and spend time practicing writing some of our popcorn words.

Science/Social Studies

In Social Studies, we will continue with our study of maps. We will discuss the difference between a map and a globe.




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Ask: What do you take a very short time to do? What do you take a long time to do? Discuss the different answers children have.





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

We can use quarters to buy gum! Draw a path from the quarters to the gumball machine by following the letter Q.

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


