

* Eligible nominees for the 2019-2020 school year are noted on the nomination form. Nominees must have completed 3 full years at SHS. In addition, teachers and staff are only eligible to be nominated if they have not received the award within the past 3 years.

MAP Assessments - Math and Language Grades 4-8 (Grade 3 Optional)

Typically, our students take MAP assessments in the fall, winter, and spring. This information is vital to measuring student growth and guiding teachers in planning curriculum and instruction. Given the unique situation we find ourselves in with remote learning, we believe gathering some of the spring data will be particularly beneficial as we plan not only the rest of this school year but how we approach next year.

For this reason, we will conduct **remote MAP assessments in Math and Language**. Both tests will be conducted on the same day and students who test will not have any additional classes that day.

- Tuesday, May 19: Middle School Math and Language No other classes that day
- Thursday, May 21: Grades 4-5 Math and Language No other classes that day
- Thursday, May 21: Grade 3 Testing by teacher request or optional Math and Language (more information to follow)

I anticipate being able to approve all applications that are submitted prior to summer break. Next school year we will be introducing an afterschool ESS option for our Pre-K program. If the combination of ESS fees and tuition creates an unmanageable financial burden for your family, please contact David Burroughs to discuss tuition assistance. If the program does not fill to capacity, we will be able to offer a soccer season plan for those who only need ESS through the end of October. If this is possible, it will be communicated in August. I speak for the entire ESS team when I say we cannot wait to resume ESS and care for your kiddos in September!
