

Easter

Perhaps your observance of Lent has been deepened by the isolation of these last few weeks. Maybe you have been too stressed and busy to spend time in prayer. Either way, we are all called to join in the celebration of the death and resurrection of the Lord. Today, tomorrow, and Sunday – Good Friday, Holy Saturday, and Easter Sunday – are the very core of our faith. The death and resurrection of the Jesus are the source of all of the grace and all of the hope that strengthen us as Christians. Like the parable of the workers in the vineyard, we are all invited to receive our reward whether we have been striving in prayer and sacrifice since Ash Wednesday or really just starting today. I encourage everyone to take the time over these three days to participate in the liturgies together as a family.



Extended Learning

I want to thank everyone who took the time to participate in our parent and student survey this week and those who have sent emails with both words of support and suggestions for improvements. Your feedback is important in planning the rest of the year.

When we switched to remote learning four weeks ago, we knew that we would not be able to simply replicate the regular school day through a computer screen. We asked all of our teachers to focus their online instruction on the core curriculum in each class and grade. This has meant that our students have shorter days overall. But it does not mean that we are skimping on learning. All of our teachers are working hard to ensure that their students are learning the fundamentals that they will need to be successful the rest of this academic year and next year, too. They are missing out on some of the "extras" that make each year memorable – Peacemakers assemblies, Student of the Week presentations, field trips, and more.

As our community (students, parents, and staff) has grown in its skill and comfort with online learning, we have been finding ways to insert more into our schedule like morning announcements and "recess". After the Easter Break we will be offering some additional educational as well.

These "extended learning" opportunities are **optional**. We understand that some families are barely managing the current workload. Others are asking for more work. We are trying to meet the needs of our whole community by continuing to focus on the core curriculum in our daily classes and offering a variety of opportunities for students before and after the regular "school day". Your child is welcome to join in any of these opportunities that fit in with your schedule. All we ask is that those who participate and engaged, respectful, and punctual – just like any other class.

More details will be sent about some of the these opportunities next week. But here is what we have planned so far.

- Book Club Open to students in grades 2 & 3 (Monday and Wednesday 12:45-1:30), grades 4 & 5 (Tuesday and Thursday 9:45-10:30), and grades 6-8 (Monday and Wednesday 8:30 -9:15). Students will read a book new book about every two weeks and join together to discuss them led by Mrs. Sneifer. In order to ensure that the students have their first book, we need to have everyone who is interested in participating email Mrs. Sneifer by Monday morning, April 13.
- **Math Enrichment** Teachers in grades 1-8 will provide additional math "challenge and extension" work for students interested in participating. Each teacher will send home an email with details for her or his class.
- IXL Students in grades K-8 can work independently online learning in math, social studies, and science with weekly opportunities to check in on their progress with staff proctors.
- **Cooking and Baking Club** Grades 1-3 with Mrs. Kirwan. Students will learn math, social studies, and language skills while creating tasty treats
- **STEM Club** Grades 2-3 and 4-6 with Mrs. Simons. Students will participate in science and engineering challenges with materials found at home.



Talent Show

We've heard your desire to find more ways to connect our community. So, we are in the process of planning an all-school Talent Show for May. The Easter Break is a great time to start thinking, planning, and practicing a performance. Performances should generally be between 1 and 3 minutes in length. Students, staff, and parents in all grades may participate. We will send out more information in next week's From the Heart.

Graduation and Other activities and traditions

With the closure of the school campus for the rest of the year, there are some traditions and activities that will have to change. However, we are committed to continuing as many of these events as possible, just in a different way than ever before. We have groups who are already brainstorming about and researching ways to hold the 8th Grade vs. Staff Volleyball game, Field Day, the Clap Out, Graduation, and more. We have already had innovative teachers and students move the Culture Fair, the Passion Play, and the Living Stations of the Cross into a digital format. More

information will follow about when and how we will be observing these traditions over the next few weeks.


