

Community Outreach

Thank you to everyone who has been bringing groceries on Thursdays for families being served by Jubilee Reach and thank you to the families who have offered to help on Mondays, too. Your generosity is making an important difference in our community. We are currently all set with families providing groceries.

We have a new opportunity to help families in need in our community. Not all families have the resources that we have, and many are struggling to keep their children educated and engaged during the closure of school campuses. Sacred Heart School will be assisting <u>Friends of the Children (FOTC) Seattle</u> by collecting items for the children that they serve. Typically, FOTC provides 16 hours of one-on-one support for Seattle area youth facing life's toughest challenges each month, from kindergarten through high school graduation. During the Coronavirus pandemic, FOTC families are struggling to provide their children educational and enriching activities to fill their days. Many of these families do not have a computer in their home, and if they do it is shared by multiple individuals and therefore the kids are not able to learn online effectively.

Consider involving your children in this outreach project by brainstorming with them which activities they have enjoyed over this extended school closure and what items children their own age might also enjoy and support their learning (e.g., books for all reading levels, workbooks, flash cards, arts and crafts supplies, puzzles, board games).

2) You may drop off items at Sacred Heart School by April 30. The best time for drop-offs is Mondays and Thursdays from 9-10 am at the back entrance to the school.

3) You may make monetary donations directly to FOTC via the <u>No Matter What</u> fund, setup specifically to assist the children served by FOTC during COVID-19 or checks can be made out to Friends of the Children Seattle and mailed to: Friends of the Children Seattle/ P.O.
